THE ELEMENTS

1. Split your class into 4 groups

2. Give each group an element (Earth, Wind,

Fire, Water) & a whiteboard or paper to write

Put 2 minutes on the timer & ask your groups to write down as many ideas as they can for

Water: sea, ocean, turtles, fishing, dolphins,

Fire: volcano, sun, heatwave, global warming,

Earth: planet, growing, farms, climate change

Wind: storms, turbines, tornado, windmills,

1. Bring your groups back together to discuss their ideas & what they could write a poem

IDEA GENERATION ACTIVITIES





- 1. Ask your class to tell you any local:
 - Green spaces
 - · Places for wildlife
- 2. Ask them:
 - What are some of the things you love about these places?
 - What can we do to protect them?
 - How can we encourage others to do the same?
 - How would you feel if these places & the wildlife were gone forever?
- Your pupils can then write a poem or story inspired by a local nature spot, describing its beauty, why they love it & encouraging others to care for the local environment too.

- ACROSTICS

 1. Download The Big Green Writing Machine
- 2. As a class discuss the words & their meanings
- Each pupil needs to pick a word to inspire their poem
- This word now becomes their acrostic word that they use for their poem



ACTIVITY 4 RAINFOREST VS OCEAN

- 1. You can pick any 2 opposite environmental themes we've chosen rainforest & ocean
- 2. On your board write down the five senses; hearing, touch, smell, taste, sight
- 3. Split your class into 2 groups one is Rainforest, the other is Ocean
- Each group needs a whiteboard(s) & pen(s)
- 5. Give your pupils a sense & 2 minutes to write down as many ideas as they can that relate to their group's theme
- Repeat for the remaining 4 senses
- 7. Bring your class together and discuss their ideas
- They can now write a sense poem about the rainforest or the ocean or a descriptive mini saga
