

# How to write a book review ...

- When writing a review try to break it up into two or three paragraphs.
- Describe the story in detail, but without giving too much away! Include information about the plot, setting and characters and your favourite parts.
- Try to describe the author's writing style. Is it realistic, descriptive, or funny? How does it make you feel? You could use quotes to help get your points across.
- Finally, try to sum up the book, explaining how you feel about it and why, and whether you learnt anything from the book. This is your chance to persuade someone to read the book – or avoid it!
